


# Getting the Software and Installing ArcGIS Pro 3.X

Clemson students, staff, and faculty can download ArcGIS Pro from the profile section of their Clemson ArcGIS Online Organization account. See below for instructions:


## 1. Signing into your ArcGIS Online Organization

- 1.1. Open a web browser. In the search box, type [arcgis.com](https://arcgis.com). In the screen that appears, click on [Sign In](#).
- 1.2. In the Sign In with screen by Esri, select [Your ArcGIS organization's URL](#) (Figure 1.1).
- 1.3. You will be asked to enter your ArcGIS organization's URL. Type *clemson* in the box, so that your URL is [clemson.maps.arcgis.com](https://clemson.maps.arcgis.com) and click on [Continue](#) (Figure 1.2).

- 1.4. In the login window, select the blue box that says [Clemson University](#) (Figure 1.3).
- 1.5. Log in using your standard Clemson username and password (Figure 1.4).




1.6. Once you login, on top-right of the screen, you see your name:



## 2. Downloading the software


2.1. Click on your name on the top right area of your window. Click on [My settings](#).

2.2. In the page that opens click on [Licenses](#).




2.3. Scroll down and click on [Download ArcGIS Pro](#).

2.4. Click on the dropdown to choose the version you want to download. Then click on [Download](#) in the blue box.




### 3. Installing the software


3.1. Once the download is complete, go to your downloads folder and find the installer file. It has an exe extension. Double click on [ArcGISPro\\_3X](#) to run the installer.



3.2. The destination should already be set for you. If you wish to change the destination folder click on [Browse](#). Otherwise click on [Next](#). After the files have been extracted, you will see the Windows Installer. Let it run.




3.3. After the installation files have been extracted successfully, click on [Close](#).




## Troubleshoot: Microsoft.NET Desktop Runtime is not installed

In case the required [Microsoft .NET Desktop Runtime](#) is not installed, the following message will pop up.




You will need to install the required version of [Microsoft .NET Desktop Runtime](#). If this warning does not prompt, move to step 3.4. Click on [OK](#) to close the warning window.


Click on [Finish](#) for now to close ArcGIS Pro Setup window.




Open a web browser, type “[Microsoft .NET Desktop Runtime](#)”, visit Microsoft website, and download a required [Microsoft .NET Desktop Runtime](#). In this example, download .Net Desktop Runtime 6.0.12 (x64).




Once the Installer is downloaded, execute it by double clicking on it.




Click on **Install** to start installation.




After successful installation, click on **Close**.




Resume installation of ArcGIS Pro. Open a destination folder where installation package was extracted (in this example, `C:\Users\CCGT\Documents\ArcGIS Pro.3.0.3\ArcGISPro`), and double click on `ArcGISPro.msi`.




3.4. The ArcGIS Pro setup program should open automatically. Then click on **Next** two times.




3.5. Now, click on **I accept the master agreement**, and click on **Next** again. When asked to choose Installation Context, choose the type you need and click on **Next**.




3.6. Select Features you need. Unless you need a specific solution, ArcGIS Pro should suffice. If you want to change installation folder, click on [change](#). For most cases, default installation directory should be good. Click on [Next](#).



3.7. If you would like to participate in the ESRI User Experience Improvement program, check the [checkbox](#). Then, click on [Install](#) to start installation.



3.8. Let the installer run and then you will see this window, click on [Finish](#)




## 4. Authorizing your software


You have several options to [authorize](#) your ArcGIS Pro software. In this tutorial, we will only use the [Named User license](#), which uses your ArcGIS Online account.

With the Named User license type, ArcGIS Pro core and extension licenses are automatically assigned to members of Clemson University's ArcGIS Online organization by CCGT staff.

- 4.1. Once the installation is finished, launch your software (go to Start menu and open ArcGIS Pro). You will be prompted to the window below. Click on [Your ArcGIS organization's URL](#).




- 4.2. Enter *Clemson* in the [Your ArcGIS organization's URL](#) box and the click on [Continue](#). In the following screen, click on [Clemson University](#).




Enter your Clemson username and password.



Click on [Open ArcGIS Pro](#).




Your software should be licensed now. Your start screen should look similar to the one below.



**Warning:** Note that if you disconnect from the Internet or if you sign out from your account, you have 60 minutes to save your work before the software automatically closes.

### Troubleshoot: Access Denied at Clemson University login

If you use **clemsonguest** Wi-Fi at Clemson University campus, you will see the following warning in signing in. To fix this issue, connect to **eduroam** Wi-Fi on the campus.




## Troubleshoot: Default Project Location is set to Cloud Storage Services, such as OneDrive and Google Drive.



As of December 21, 2022, ArcGIS Pro does not support the use of **Cloud Storage Services**, such as OneDrive and Google Drive, unless otherwise stated in the ArcGIS Pro user interface or documentation about specific tools and functionality. By default, projects are saved to your user profile directory at Documents\ArcGIS\Projects. Depending on each workstation's configuration, some user profile directories use Cloud Storage Services.

To confirm, start ArcGIS Pro, click on [Map](#) icon, and see Location of [Create a New Project](#) window pops up. See [Location](#) to confirm if default Project Location uses Cloud Storage Services. This example below shows that OneDrive is used for a default location. In this case, it is highly recommended to change its default Project Location to a local folder that does not use Cloud Storage Services to avoid any unexpected issues.



To change default Project Location, go to [Setting](#), click on [Options](#) to open Options window.



Under **Application** tab, click on **General**, and open “**Create projects**”. Select **New projects are saved in a custom location** and click on **folder icon** to specify location (Figure T.1). In this example, select **ArcGIS** folder which was created in D drive, a local data drive. Select **ArcGIS** folder and click on **OK** twice (Figure T.2 and T.3). From the next time, ArcGIS Pro will create a new project under the specified folder (Figure T.4).






